Updated Policies:



Every month we focus on a different topic in Numeracy and Literacy. Some parents have indicated that they would like to know what topic the children are focussing on and how they can help at home. To support you in helping your child/ren at home we are going to give some tips and advice each month as to how you can help. We hope this will be of benefit to you but please let us know.

Numeracy

In Numeracy we focus on Number every month but then also another element of Numeracy. This month our topic is **TIME**.

Here are some ideas to help you support your child with **TIME**.

- Talk to your child about the time
- Ask your child to tell you the time.
- Ask your child what time will it be in one hour, in another half an hour, in five more minutes etc

Encourage your child to say the days of the week and the months of the year.

- Ask your child to tell you the time on a digital clock as well as an analogue clock i.e 12.30 is half past 12, 11.15 is a quarter past 11 etc
- Encourage your child to look at the TV guide for the times of programmes etc.
- Older children can tell you the time in 24 hr clock form as well as times in a.m and p.m
- Encourage your children to tell you how long things will take i.e How long will a programme last? How long does it take to play a game of football? etc
- Look at bus timetables, plane schedules and ask questions about those e.g which bus would be the best to take if I need to be in Belfast for 4.00p.m etc
- Talk about the time in different countries.

Literacy: In Literacy we are focussing this month on Instructional Writing-Writing potions, spells, instructions for making toffee apples, pumpkin designing etc

PDMU

As we are focussing on Mental Health and Well-Being, we are continuing to focus on the MIND ME, MIND YOU programme this year across the school. This involves the whole school talking about and devising strategies for five different areas to support mental health and well-being. Being a Good Friend, Kindness, Resilience, Fair Play and Gratitude. November is Anti-Bullying month here in the school.

This month in PDMU we are focussing on inclusion-making sure everyone is included in games and activities and supporting our friends when they aren't sure of what to do .

Morning Club

The school is open from 8.30 a.m in the mornings to facilitate those parents who wish to drop off children early. Supervision is available in the mobile from 8.30-9.00a.m. There is a small cost for this service of 50p per day payable to Siobhan in the morning or weekly. Thanks

Exercise-A-Thon

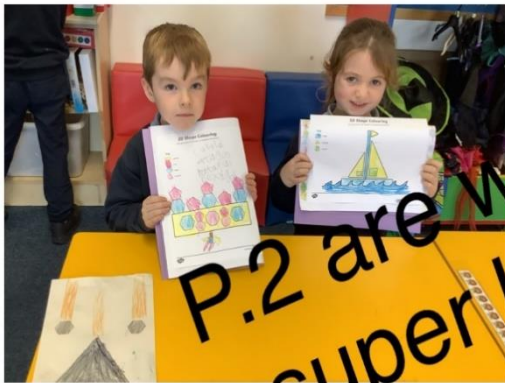

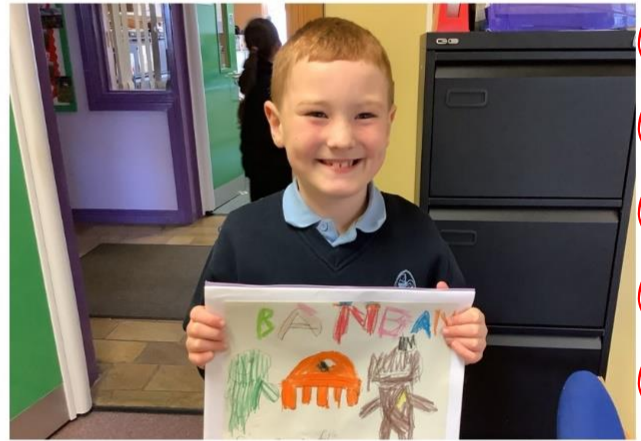
